Interactive & Immersive: Sing and sign along! Get hands-on! Spectacular video projections (several created from artworks by students from the special education schools) illuminate the Singapore Indoor Stadium. Be spirited away!

Cultivating a Legacy: We want to discover and nurture new talents. Apart from household names, we are working with tomorrow's stars. Through the ceremony, we aim to shift perspectives. Let's be a catalyst for change in how we view disability in Singapore and the region.

Tariao and which features 15-year-old Luo Mang, who is autistic. The performance is set against Kleopatra Korai's breathtaking hand-drawn animation which introduces us to the 15 sports to be played at the Games. This leads us to the National Anthem brought to you by Chao Yang, Grace Orchard and other special education schools. Then, against a stunning film, comes the grand parade of the 1,500 participants of the Games, the very people who know all about pushing their physical and mental limits to reach their goals.

Let us forge a new 'en-abled' vision. Let us work hand-in-hand with our ASEAN friends to achieve new heights in sport and the arts, as well as the way we live, in our work and play.



Swimmer Theresa Goh 'splashes' onto the screen and shows you why she is a champion. The video poem leads us onto ASEAN Best, which is a celebration of the last seven Games. Redeafination, Singapore's stellar hip hop dance group for the deaf, dances to a film installation created by Michael Larsson. This is followed by Personal Best, which valorises our great sporting heroes and heroines for whom their greatest competitors are themselves. On stage is a diverse group of ASEAN talents including singers Natasha Gray (Philippines), Crenshaw Yeo (Singapore) and 13-year-old Indah Wahyu (Indonesia), who are accompanied by pianist Lui Chee Chau (Malaysia), marimbist Lily Goh (Singapore), guitarist Daniel Purnomo (Indonesia), keyboardist Samantha Gray (Philippines), as well as a film by Yan Tuck Hong.

Being among athletes dedicated to their game has been overwhelming. We want our work to express the beauty and power of the Games, and to capture the soul and sounds of what goes on behind the scenes of the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.
