I am a lecturer, researcher, artist, visual director, curator and advisor with a twenty-year international portfolio. My works have toured 450 exhibitions/conferences/publications (such as dOCUMENTA; Biennale of Sydney; transmediale; Artangle Open100, 8th ASEAN Para Games, at locations such as ICA, Tokyo Wonder Site, Dom Muzyki, MOMA and ZKM) in roughly 50 cities.
